

Symposium in Sofia: Celebrating International Pathology Day 2014!

International Pathology Day 2014 Sofia, Bulgaria 5 November 2014

The Bulgarian Academy of Science and Art (BASA) in cooperation with, and under the auspices of WASPaLM organized An Educational symposium to celebrate International Pathology Day, in Sofia, Bulgaria on Wednesday, November 05, 2014.



- Prof. Gamze Mocan Kuzey, past president of WASPaLM opened the symposium with the
 talk "HPV Effects on PAP Smears and Screening Policy". She emphasized the global
 burden of cancer, the role of genital HPV on PAP smears, and the preanalytical,
 analytical and post analytical phase in quality assurance with respect to current and
 future strategies for the prevention and early detection of cervical cancer.
- Prof. Boyadjieva presented a timely talk an overview of "Stem Cells in Medicine";
- Prof. Genova gave a talk entitled "Integrated Diagnostics of Indolent Lymphoma", including next generation sequencing, diagnostic guidelines and future diagnostic and prognostic abilities.
- Prof. Svinarov spoke about the role of "Vitamin D in Health and Disease: Implications in Oncology" and emphasized the protective role of vitamin D in various diseases, including cancer.

Report of the participation of the WASPaLM delegation in the 136th WHO Conference

The delegation of WASPaLM, constituted by Professor Roberto Verna, President of the Italian Association of Clinical Pathology and Molecular Medicine, Representative of WASPaLM to WHO, and Dr. Paula Tavora, president of the Brazilian Society for Clinical Pathology - SBPC / ML, attended the 136th Meeting of the Executive Board of the World Health Organization (WHO) in Geneva, Switzerland, from 26th January to 3rd February 2015.

The main topics discussed (excluding the administrative items) have been the following (Items and sub items).

Non Communicable Diseases: Outcome of the Second International Conference on Nutrition and WHO's role in its follow up.

- Update of the commission on Ending Childhood Obesity
- Follow up the 2014 high level meeting of the United Nations General Assembly to undertake a comprehensive review and assessment of the progress achieved in the prevention and control of non-communicable diseases.

Promoting Health Through the Life Course

Monitoring the achievement of the health related millennium development goals HEALTH AND THE ENVIRONMENT

- Addressing the health impact of air pollution
- · Climate and health: outcome of the WHO Conference on Health and Climate

2014 Ebola virus disease outbreak

EBOLA - Social stigma

Ebola was first identified in Africa in 1976, in two simultaneous outbreaks in Sudan and the Democratic Republic of Congo. It was in this country that the disease was named, as it was first diagnosed in a village near the Ebola River.

Spread through almost the entire African continent, Ebola affects more intensely countries facing severe economic situation, with weak health systems, lack of human. In the 136th Meeting of the Executive Council in Geneva, WHO was heavily criticized for having been late to respond to the call of the risk of the epidemics, resources

and infrastructure, and long periods of civil war and political instability, as it happened in 2010 in Liberia, Sierra Leone and Guinea (Guinea).

Our presence in WHO meetings and conferences was very relevant since the opportunity opens up new fronts for WASPaLM and its Constituent Societies. We had three special meetings: one of these was with Dr. Irena Pratt, of the WHO Committee in charge of the prerequisites for regulating the In Vitro Diagnostics. Another meeting was with the Brazilian Infectologist Marco Vitoria, Department of HIV / AIDS WHO. The third meeting was with Dr. Regina Ungerer, Brazilian Doctor, responsible for the network "ePORTUGUÊSe" (www.who.int/eportuguese/pt), a program to support the development and training of human resources for laboratories in countries that adopt Portuguese as an official language.

The closing remarks and thanks were provided by Dr. Suzy Lishman, President-Elect (now President), the Royal College of Pathologists, UK. She emphasised the significant role of Pathology and the need to strengthen the teaching and training of Pathology and Laboratory services, globally.
