26th WASPaLM World Congress & ASCP Annual Meeting, Las Vegas, October 2011

WASPaLM, representatives of its Constituent Societies, representing many countries, met in Las Vegas in October 2011 at the 26th Biennial World Congress of WASPaLM and the Annual Meeting of the American Society of Clinical Pathology. The Educational sessions and all Administrative Meetings were held at the Venetian Palazzo. The meeting was attended by over 2,000 registrants and the Educational sessions, which covered a wide array of topics, were extremely well attended. Several of the WASPaLM Executive presented at the Educational Sessions and of course many members of the Constituent Societies attended the educational sessions.

During the meeting, the Presidency of WASPaLM changed from Dr. Michael Oellerich to Dr. Gamze Mocan Kuzey who became the 25th President of WASPaLM. Dr. Jagdish Butany remains the 13th Secretary-Treasurer of WASPaLM. Dr Lai Meng Looi (Kuala Lumpur, Malaysia) is the president elect.

The collaboration with Abbott, Labs are Vital initiative, has begun. With this, Ab-

bott will provide funding on an annual basis for traveling lectureships. Guidelines for these have been set and Constituent Societies are welcome to approach the WASPaLM Education Committee or the Secretary-Treasurer's office for use of these Abbott's Labs are Vital travelling lectureships. Further information regarding this is available on the WASPaLM website.

The WASPaLM Bureau(and the World Pathology Foundation) met in three separate sessions(over 15 hours in total). There were long discussions about the year past, the future. of WASPaLM and discussions on improving contacts with Constituent Societies.

A critical fact that remains to be tackled is the need for additional operating funds to enable WASPaLM to persue its aims, broaden its activities and achieve its goals. At this time, the only source of funds, that WASPaLM has, remains the small amount in dues paid by Constituent Societies, the revenues obtained by the Japan Administrative office and any funds obtained from the World

Congresses.. This, by itself, is nowhere near enough to even maintain the Administrative Offices and activities.

Further efforts are therefore critical to raise additional funds, annually and worldwide..

An Education Subcommittee has been set up under the Chairpersonship of Dr. Gamze Mocan Kuzey with members Professor Lai-Meng Looi(President Elect), Dr. Paul Raslavicus, Dr. Roberto Ruiz-Arenas and Dr. Lia Partakusuma. This committee will come up with plans for educational activities in their regions on a prospective basis. We await their report and hope that there will be more regional educational meetings. These could number between one and more than that in each year. These meetings should be self supporting, and well advertised so that regional representatives could attend them in neighboring countries.

This past year saw many significant activities. These include:

- 1. The invited presentations at many meetings in Europe and in Asia, by our President Dr Michael Oellerich.
- 2.A number of meetings were Cosponsored by WASPaLM, at no cost to ourselves
- 3. The signing of the Memorandum of Understanding with Abbott's Labs are Vital Program, and the beginning of the program.
- 4. The signing of an MOU, with

IFCC and later with APFCC.

5. Guest attendance of Dr Sun Fei, General Secretary of the Chinese Society of Laboratory Medicine, at the Bureau meetings at Las Vegas,

We expect the CSLM to become a member of WASPaLM, soon.

Each of these will ,we expect, lead to an increase in WASPaLM Educational activities.

At the Bureau, newly redesigned WASPaLM pins were distributed to members of Constituent Societies and to some of the attending members of the ASCP congress.

The 27th World Congress of the World Association of Societies of Pathology and Laboratory Medicine was held in conjunction with the Annual meeting of the American Society of Clinical Pathologists. The meeting was very well attended(over 2000 attendees) and the Educational Programs covered a large breadth of Laboratory Medicine, and were of excellent quality. Those who attended had a great time and choosing between educational programs to attend was often difficult. The next World Congress will be held in Quebec City, Canada from June 8 to 12, 2013. The address by President William Clinton was extremely well received, and the subsequent Question and Answer session was both lively and informative. This was followed by another excellent presentation by Dr Paul Farmer who is well known for his work amongst the disadvantaged, especially in Haiti.

As they pointed out:

"Tumour is Rumor Tissue is the issue."

This Highlights very clearly, even for the lay person, the importance of tissue diagnosis and the role of the laboratory and the Pathologist in patient care.

In essence, anyone can say what they want, but till a pathologist signs a report saying that the tissue shows a cancer (and more details) no one is going to treat the patient!

Several members of the WASPaLM Executive/Bureau presented educational session, which were very well received. The session on International Health was timely and good.

The conference facility was superb and all of the ASCP staff were extremely helpful! The Silent Auction raised over \$2000 for the World Pathology Foundation!

Needless to say, the other parts of the facilities at the Palazzo Hotel had their share of visitors and one could hear the machines making their tinkling sounds all day(and night). Someone was making money, as they are supposed to, in the City of Las Vegas!

At the meetings of the WASPaLM Bureau a wide range of topics was discussed. One of the items discussed was the need for greater involvement of Constituent Societies in the World Congress as well as greater involvement with the WASPaLM Executive in the organization of regional meetings.

Such a list would be invaluable as we try and make membership representative of regions and Societies.

Annual meetings of Constituent Societies:

As in previous years, I would like to remind you that WASPaLM is happy to be a cosponsor of your Annual Meeting(s), should you desire this. However, please note that no financial contribution can be made by WASPaLM to the annual meeting.

NEW this year!! Funding: As of this year, there are some funds available for visiting speakers. Should you have a meeting at which you need a particular speaker with a particular specialty interest, please let us know and we will see if we can arrange the funding for this. If you need a speaker for a particular topic, we will be glad to help find a suitable individual. For obvious reasons, this funding is somewhat limited and will be available on a first come, first served basis. If you have a particular speaker in mind, we would be willing to see if we can help with that individuals visit for the Educational Program.

Requisites: One of the conditions for this funding is that it only covers Economy class airfare and some of the local travel- homeairport-home expenses, while the rest of the expenses must be covered by the host society. Board and lodging for the visiting speaker is to be covered by the Host Society. The speak-

er is expected to give more than one talk, at more than one institution and a copy of the presentation is to be made available to be kept on the WASPaLM website, so others may also benefit from the lecture..
